We live at the corner of **an example at the corner where the gas station used to be-- it included an invitation to a comment** session but we only received the mailing a couple days before-- not nearly enough time to free up time to attend.

We could not oppose this more strongly! We are also totally disturbed by and opposed to the large tank proposed there which will store flammables (!?)

This is a neighborhood. It's bad enough that we live on one of the most dangerous intersections in the city, which is nonetheless incredibly well foot-trafficked, and that we have to cross to it with our 16 month old son multiple times a day; and worry that someday he'll be hurt there, or on 16 itself which is a residential road disguised as a highway---
