All proceeds from this event benefit Dysautonomia International in support of POTS research. Participants are welcome to join us after the race for entertainment and refreshments. POTS (Postural Orthostatic Tachycardia Syndrome) is a debilitating autonomic nervous systems disorder that affects an estimated 1 million Americans. There is currently no cure and very little awareness regarding the illness. Research funds are scarce and desperately needed.

POTS Walk & 5K Race Safety Plan

We are working with the Medford and Somerville Police Departments, Medford Mayors Office, Medford Parks Department, Massachusetts Department of Conservation and Recreation, and the Principal of the McGlynn Middle School. All volunteer coordinators will be given a list of all cell phone numbers and names of key people. A volunteer orientation will be given with specific instructions in the event of an emergency.

The course will be marked with chalk arrows along the running paths, signs every .5 mile and course monitors at each turn. The course map is posted on our website and race flyer.

The race begins and ends at the Mystic River Bend Reservation behind the McGlynn Middle School. Registration will begin at 8:30 a.m. and the race will start at 10 a.m. The entire race takes place along walking paths and sidewalks along the Mystic River. The runners/walkers at no point cross traffic and no road closures are required. A police cruiser will lead the runners for the entire race either along the walking paths when possible or the adjacent roadway. The race course will be swept by the police and volunteers on bicycles before the course is closed.

Water and food will be provided after the race at the Mystic River Bend Reservation. Bathroom facilities will be available at the McGlynn Middle School. The McGlynn Middle School cafeteria will be opened in the event of inclement weather.

A first-aid tent will be located at the start/finish line. Two volunteer EMTs from MIT will be manning the first aid tent.
