Mr. Hadley told the members that FST consultants performed a street pavement plan for the city in 2012 that included checking every mile of roadway in the city and producing a GIS map with paving condition index ratings, (PCI), for each street. Based on the number of miles of roadway and number of workers in the city, Somerville received \$1.1 million in Chapter 90 funds in 2013. Mr. Boukili reported that \$2.8 million has been budgeted for streets in the capital plan. Ms. Miguel explained that it takes 2-3 months to put together a package to re-pave a street.

Chairman McWatters suggested that a presentation on this subject be made to a Committee of the Whole.
