Dear NACTO Members,

I'm delighted to announce that members-only **early bird registration** is now open for the NACTO Designing Cities 2024 conference! This year's conference, hosted by Miami-Dade, will take place this May 7-10 at the Intercontinental Miami.

Registration will be open to **NACTO member cities and agencies** exclusively for the next month (until February 7) to ensure members have first dibs on WalkShops and workshops. The early bird rate (\$750) will be available **until March 1st**. Note that WalkShops and the hotel block book up quickly!

Designing Cities 2024: Miami will focus on the intersecting themes of safety, climate, equity, sustainable growth, and regional collaboration. [Read more](#) about how these themes will be woven throughout the conference, and learn about our host, Miami-Dade county.

What you need to know:

1. **Early Registration:** Early bird registration for NACTO members is \$750 through February 29. Registration for NACTO members increases to \$850 on March 1. Note that registration opens more broadly to non-members on February 7—lock yours in to get your preferred WalkShops and workshops.
Each NACTO member agency gets one complimentary registration. Information on signing up will be sent to your city's/agency's primary contact today.
2. **WalkShops:** Registration includes three WalkShops at no extra cost! Be sure to [read WalkShop descriptions](#) for this year's conference before registering (and note that popular ones fill up fast—have some alternates in mind).
3. **Workshops:** #NACTO2024 workshops range from trainings in successful federal grant applications to facilitation skills that turn around fraught public meetings. Note that there is limited space available in each workshop, and each workshop is \$300.
4. **Hotels:** #NACTO2024 is headquartered at the Intercontinental Miami. We have a **limited amount of rooms at the GSA rate of \$199/night from May 6th-10th only**, so book early! After those rooms sell out, or if you want to book an additional reservation to stay the weekend, [book a room in our block](#) at a rate of \$229/night (also at a limited capacity).
5. **Better Bike Share Partnership (BBSP):** This year, NACTO's BBSP Roundtable—bringing together practitioners to make shared bike and e-scooter programs more equitable—will take place during the first day of the conference. If you are working directly on managing or administering a shared micromobility program, submit [this form](#) to show your interest in attending.
6. **Safety:** NACTO is committed to an engaging, inclusive, supportive, and productive atmosphere for the conference, and we invite and expect all of our participants to commit to helping us build this atmosphere and this community. Read more [here](#).

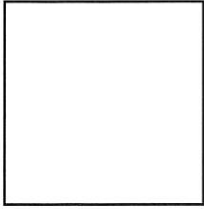

The conference will take place at the Intercontinental Miami (<https://www.icmiami.com/>) from Tuesday, May 7 to Friday, May 10, 2024.

Registration

Details on ticket costs and what is included will be available on November 14th, 2023 so that you can budget well in advance. Early bird registration for our members will open on January 10th, 2024. General registration will open in February 2024.

Participants

1,000 transportation professionals attend the conference each year. NACTO aims to make the conference broadly accessible—especially to city staff. City practitioners are at the core of our conference and make up more than 70% of our conference audience. NACTO member cities and agencies (<https://nacto.org/member-cities/>) get priority registration with access to registration earlier than anyone else, complimentary attendance for one attendee per agency, and a discounted rate.

AICP Credits

After the event, you can receive AICP credits for each workshop, breakout session, and Walkshop you attended.

Programming

The NACTO conference features a mix of formats over four days that promote connection, inspiration, and sharing best practices and lessons learned. The agenda features workshops with hands-on exercises, roundtable discussions, keynote speakers, seamless networking opportunities, panel conversations, and small group meet ups by affinity or topic expertise.

Our conference is best known for our Walkshops - mobile tours of our host city and region that are designed and led by local staff and community members. Three Walkshops are included in the price of each conference ticket for every attendee.

Our program also features our beloved Meet the Cities event, where every NACTO member agency has the chance to share a project they worked on that year.

Last but not least, you can expect to have fun! Mornings kick off with jogs or yoga. Get out of the hotel and join the host for "Neighborhood Dinners" across the city to check out a local's restaurant recommendation. On the first day of our event we have an opening reception for all attendees. Past receptions have included live spray painting and music underneath an underpass; live music from the Uncivil Servants at a historic concert venue; and yard games and food trucks at a brewery.

Logistics: Dress code

For the majority of conference activities in the hotel, we recommend business casual/professional attire. For Walkshops, we recommend whatever is comfortable for physical activity and the weather of our host region. Be sure to review the details of your Walkshop - some past tours have required that participants wear sturdy closed-toe shoes, for example.

Logistics: What you should bring

Please bring a reusable water bottle (extra important for Walkshops!), a notebook, a pen, sun protection, and whatever else helps keep you sustained through travel, mobile tours, and a busy week of conference programming! While we will have some on site, we also recommend you bring a mask for COVID-19 protection.

Safety at the conference

NACTO is committed to an engaging, inclusive, supportive, and productive atmosphere for the conference, and we invite all of our participants to commit to helping us build this atmosphere and this community.

We will take a number of measures in planning the conference to help build a safe and inclusive space, including providing a number of opportunities for affinity spaces (including for BIPOC and LGBT+ attendees), working closely with our partners to ensure Walkshops are well-staffed and have a reliable emergency protocol in place, providing gender-neutral restrooms, and providing high-quality masks to those who wish to take COVID-19 precautions.

NACTO's Director of People and Culture, Lauren Nixon, will be the main point of contact regarding safety concerns during the conference. Lauren will serve as a liaison between our conference participants and the hotel staff to ensure that our conference attendees have a great experience and are connected to the hotel staff, who can offer them the resources that they need to have a comfortable experience.
