6. Mayor's Communication (ID # <u>24-1614</u>)

Conveying an update on water and sewer rate restructuring.

Dave Fox from Raftelis Consulting presented an update on water and sewer rate structures, focusing on equity and fairness for residents, through a report

entitled *Equity - 2024-12-10 Water&Sewer Update (with 24-1614).* Discussions included potential stormwater fees, gathering data related to impervious ground, credit programs, resource for residents to calculate their bills, and ensuring accurate billing following rate changes. An Open House in October provided residents with information on Water and Sewer operations and upcoming rate changes.

Water and Sewer Director Demetrios Vidalis detailed the updates from the report, including plans to offer credit programs for seniors and those with accessibility needs. There is ongoing development of a resource for residents to estimate their bills and a process for gathering impervious surface data using aerial photos and GPS.

Council members raised concerns about the appeals process, which is still being developed, and how the rate changes will impact public housing and small businesses. The contractor emphasized that a full statistical analysis will be done before implementing fixed rates.

In conclusion, Raftelis outlined next steps: addressing data integrity, ensuring accurate billing systems, and continuing community outreach, with the goal of fully implementing the plan by FY 2026.
