1. Approval of the May 13, 2020 Minutes

Safety Issues

- **2. 209363: Discuss** (Ballantyne, McLaughlin) That the Director of SPCD discuss implementing a "Don't Block the Box" campaign to ease intersection congestion at locations along Broadway, including McGrath Highway.
- **3. 202105: Discuss** (Davis, Niedergang) That the Administration develop a process for interim crosswalk painting and/or other measures to protect pedestrians when road work or other conditions prevent the immediate re-striping of road markings.
- **4. 206407: Discuss** (Ewen-Campen) That the Director of SPCD, the City Engineer, and the Commissioner of Public Works establish a written policy for deploying temporary safety

and visibility materials for the period between street re-paving and re-painting.

Bicycling and bike lanes

- **5. 210593: Discuss** (Ballantyne, Strezo) That the Director of Constituent Services and the Chief of Police discuss tracking bicycle crashes and how 311 and 911 staff are trained to handle such calls.
- **6. 209783: Discuss** (Ballantyne, Scott) That the Director of SPCD and the Chief of Police discuss what can be done to mitigate delivery trucks' use of bike lanes and cycling tracks as parking when making deliveries.
- 7. 210554: Discuss (Ewen-Campen, Mbah) That the Director of SPCD and the Director of Parking work with the Ward 3 City Councilor, Riverside Community Care, and residents on mitigating the parking and traffic issues associated with the new Riverside facility at 117 Summer Street.

Mystic River bike and pedestrian bridge

- 27. 206693: Discuss (Niedergang) That the Director of SPCD or the Director of Traffic and Parking alter the cycle of the traffic signals at Lowell Street and Highland Avenue ASAP to allow more time for vehicles to turn onto Highland Avenue from Lowell Street, especially during the morning rush hour, to alleviate the traffic backup on Hudson Street when the Cedar Street/Highland Avenue intersection is closed for construction.
- **28. 207279: Discuss** (Ewen-Campen) That the Chief of Police enforce the speed limit on Sycamore Street, between Highland Avenue and Medford Street, and inform the Ward 3 Alderman on the outcome.
- **29. 207281: Discuss** (Ewen-Campen) That the Director of SPCD work with the Ward 3 Alderman to address long-standing congestion at the intersection of Highland Avenue and Hamlet Street.
- **30. 207463: Discuss** (McLaughlin, Hirsch) That the Director of Traffic and Parking explain the recent addition of NO PARKING signs on Glen Street and remove them if there is no practical reason for them.
