Tom Taylor's Report on the Somerville Public Schools November 8, 2012

> Community Forum on Education

More than 75 members of the Somerville community participated in the Community Forum on Education – Supporting All Learners on Sunday, November 4, 2012. Guest presenter Debbie LeeKeenan, Director of the Eliot Pearson Children's School at Tufts University, led a presentation and discussion on Differentiated Instruction and Learning. This was the second in a series of Community Forums on education which began last March as a collaborative effort organized by the District's Somerville Family Learning Collaborative, Progress Together for Somerville and the Somerville School Committee. The Forums are sponsored by the Mayor's Office, Somerville Administrators' Association, the Somerville Council of PTAs, and the Somerville Teachers Association.

Update on Early Learning Challenge Grant

As noted in my last report, Somerville was one of only 5 communities across the state to be awarded a Race to the Top Early Learning Challenge Grant. An Alignment Coordinator position has been posted and applications are being reviewed as they are received. Initial work on designing and developing a database to support mapping efforts as part of this grant is expected to start within 2 weeks. As part of the grant, the District will also be participating in a study of communities that are implementing strategic plans to address the "Birth to Grade 3" alignment, and is coordinating with the EEC (Early Education and Care) on this study.

> Pakistan Visitors

On Thursday, November 1st, Somerville Public Schools hosted three Public Administrators from Pakistan as part of the Massachusetts Municipal Association's "U.S. Pakistan Professional Partnership Program". Guests were:
