#### 1. Approval of the December 7, 2020 Minutes

#### **Strategic Planning**

- 2. 210893: Discuss (Niedergang, Davis, Ewen-Campen, Ballantyne, Clingan, Strezo, Mbah, Scott, Rossetti, McLaughlin, White Jr.) That the Mayor submit a supplemental budget request to immediately add staff and funding to the Mobility Division for traffic calming, and increase its staff and funding by at least 50% in FY22.
- **3. 206691: Discuss** (Niedergang, Hirsch, Ewen-Campen, Ballantyne, Clingan) That the Director of SPCD prioritize for this Board the traffic calming projects in the City, and the process to determine those priorities.
- **4. 207499: Recommend** (Hirsch, Niedergang, Ballantyne, Ewen-Campen, Mbah) That the Administration respond to the requests outlined in the attached resident petition, organized

by the Pedestrian and Transit Advocacy Group, to accelerate traffic calming investments and improve coordination and oversight.

**5. 207996: Discuss** 8 residents submitting comments re: #207499, a proposal to accelerate traffic calming investments.

## **Potential Solutions to Traffic Dangers**

- 6. 210965: Discuss (Niedergang, Mbah, Strezo, Davis) That the Director of SPCD report to this Council in writing by December 4, and discuss with the Traffic and Parking Committee at its next meeting on December 7, what the plan is for replacing flex posts when they are knocked over or displaced.
- 7. 210894: Discuss (Davis, Ewen-Campen, Scott, Clingan, Ballantyne, Strezo, Niedergang, Rossetti, McLaughlin, Mbah, White Jr.) That the Administration expand and maintain the use of bollards and other pedestrian safety measures citywide so they are replaced immediately as needed.
- 8. 210966: Discuss (Niedergang, Ewen-Campen, Scott, Clingan, Ballantyne, Strezo, Davis, Rossetti, McLaughlin, Mbah, White Jr.) That the Director of SPCD report to this Council why there are still so few speed bumps in the city, especially since the ones deployed on Powder House Boulevard seem to be making a dangerous area safer for pedestrians.
- **9. 210967: Discuss** (Niedergang, Ewen-Campen, Scott, Clingan, Ballantyne, Strezo, Davis, Rossetti, McLaughlin, Mbah, White Jr.) That the Director of SPCD explain to this Council in writing the Administration's opposition to deploying speed bumps, with less than a half-dozen installed citywide.
- **10. 210993: Discuss** (Niedergang, Strezo, Ballantyne) That the Director of SPCD review the attached presentation by Zachary Rosenberg, Chair of the Pedestrian and Transit Advisory Committee, and report to the Traffic and Parking Committee how the successful traffic calming measures implemented in the Netherlands can be replicated here.

- **12. 211052: Discuss** (Niedergang, Mbah, Ballantyne, Ewen-Campen) That the Director of SomerStat, the Director of SPCD, and the Director of Parking re-convene the Parking Study Task Force in January 2021.

when they will implement the Mobility Plan for West Broadway (from Route 16 to Holland Street), to create a dedicated bus lane.

# **Dangerous Intersections and Roadways**

- **15. 202108: Discuss** (Davis) That the Administration work with the City of Cambridge to improve pedestrian safety at the intersections of Elm Street with Beech Street and Willow Avenue, including consideration of a Pedestrian Hybrid Beacon.
- **16. 208008: Discuss** (Davis, Ballantyne) That the Director of SPCD implement traffic calming and pedestrian and cyclist safety measures on Broadway from Powder House Circle to Teele Square.
