Alderman Rossetti reported on the items discussed at the meeting. The amendment of Ordinance 11-125 to include Board approval of water rates was approved as amended. The approval of an item to establish a senior citizen water and sewer discount was approved with income limits and asset limits. Also discussed was a home rule petition for rate reductions for resident property owners, shifting costs to a absentee owners. An Order that the City Solicitor draft a home rule petition to provide relief to resident property owners, like the residential property tax exemption, was approved. The Condominium Conversion Ordinance was discussed and discussion will remain in committee. The Committee also discussed affordable housing proposals on Tenancy Preservation and Waiting Lists, which will also be kept in Committee. Finally, the Committee recommended adoption of MGL Chapter 90 Section 17C to reduce the speed limit in the City to 25 mph, but not on State roadways.

Discussion of Ordinance 11-125 followed. The Board approved amendments clarifying that any new rates and charges must be provided to the Board of Aldermen on or before June 1 for its review and approval, and that failure to hold a Public Hearing or provide the Board with the proposed charges or rates shall prohibit the City from making any increases in rates and charges.

The Mayor addressed the Board with information regarding the Green Line Extension, infrastructure, and zoning.

The GLX will remove tens of thousands of cars from the roadways every day. When designing the City's \$50 million contribution, the City will try to shift the tax burden from residential tax payers to commercial tax payers. The GLX will create jobs, improving access to employment and affordable housing, and improving public health by reducing air pollution. Without the City's financial support, the GLX will not move forward.

With respect to infrastructure, almost 20,000 households--half the City--are linked to the combined sewer and water system that runs through Union Square. With frequent flooding and back-ups, the system needs to be improved. The project has two phases; utility upgrades and streetscape upgrades. A bond will be requested from the Board in February. Principal will not have to be paid until five years into the project. Hopefully construction can begin in the spring of 2017. The streetscape phase should follow about one year later. The current cost estimate is \$70 million. The City has received a \$3.3 million Mass Works Grant and has applied for another \$13 million.

A completely updated Zoning Ordinance is set to be presented to the Board in June. A Union Square zoning proposal has been submitted to the Board. It will attract private investment requiring a 60/40 commercial/residential split, and provide over 12 acres of public open space while reducing parking demands with a shift from cars to walking, biking and public transportation. The Board discussed the cost of these projects, and the Mayor said the GLX proposal would be submitted in November, and the cost of the infrastructure improvements would be provided once it's determined. Alderman McLaughlin would like to see a community benefits agreement for the Green Line Extension and for zoning. Alderman Lafuente was saddened by the Winter Hill revitalization program being put on the back burner again. President White asked for the property tax increases in years to come, with and without the offsets caused by development.
