1.) The parties agree to amend the Contract Amount by \$ 315,515.00 to a new amount of \$ 915,515.00

1.2) The parties agree to amend the end of the Contract Term (and Completion Date) to the following: 6/30/2022

2.) Insurance. Concurrent with the execution of this Amendment, the Vendor shall deposit with the City new policies or certificates of insurance, in form and substance satisfactory to the City, for any additional insurance coverage required by this Amendment or existing insurance coverage about to expire.

3.) Continuing Representations. Execution of this Amendment by the Vendor shall constitute an affirmation that the certifications, representations, and warranties contained in the Contract remain true and correct.

4.) No Default. Execution of this Amendment by the Vendor shall constitute and affirm that the Vendor is not in default of any certification, representation, warranty, covenant or other provision contained in the Contract and no event has occurred which, but for the lapse of time or service of notice, or both, would constitute a default thereunder.

Weston & Sampson has prepared this proposal to provide additional environmental and construction oversight support for the Conway Park Site in Somerville, Massachusetts (the Site). As you are aware, the Site is currently regulated under the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA) and the Massachusetts Contingency Plan (MCP, 310 CMR 40.0000), for the detection of polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs) and lead in soil, and the Rehabilitation and Remediation Project (the Project) is underway.

Our original scope to the City was prepared in 2019 and enacted in 2020. At that time, the level of effort for design, coordination with EPA and MassDEP, as well as the contractor schedule for oversight was unknown. We also made assumptions for the number of meetings and deliverables for the project. For example, our original scope assumed that the design would be simpler and that the project would be split into 3 phases. We also assumed that we would only need 10 weeks of oversight. As you know the coordination and design levels of effort far exceeded the original estimate but did result in EPA's financial commitment to the overall project.

While we do have some money left in the existing contract, we have developed this amendment to capture construction and regulatory compliance tasks to complete the project. This proposal includes field and office support for oversight of construction and remediation activities, reporting to maintain compliance with the appropriate regulatory programs (including public involvement activities), project management, outreach, coordination with EPA and other stakeholders, and future meetings.

As discussed, this proposal includes several tasks and sub-tasks currently being performed at the request of the City. There are tasks included here that were not previously performed due to numerous other required services performed under our existing contract that have used up project budget. For example multiple outreach meetings and meetings with the City Council, support to bring EPA's Emergency Removals Program on board, additional weekly meetings with the project team, coordination with utility providers and the MBTA, and response to contractor questions.

We have assumed a 22-week construction schedule with full time oversight and then some limited time after October. We anticipate weekly on-site meetings that the Licensed Site Professional (LSP) will attend as well as limited other meetings. Currently we are meeting on Tuesday and Thursday weekly. We anticipate continued involvement with the LSP to address Requests for Information (RFIs) from the contractor, review of payment Requisitions, Change Orders, and coordination with EPA and MassDEP. We also have responded to additional requests for information from EPA Region 1 PCB Coordinator, Ms. Kim Tisa. In addition, the scope includes documents required to close out the site in accordance with both TSCA and the MCP.

SCOPE OF WORK

Task 1 – Construction Phase Support

Weston & Sampson will provide resident representative services (Environmental Scientist) for contractor oversight for the remainder of the Project. The resident representative will document daily tasks completed by the contractor, equipment on-site, and measures taken by the contractor to meet the requirements of the Risk Based Disposal Plan (RBDP) and Project Plans and Specifications. Under this scope we are assuming full time oversight (8 hours

per day for 22 weeks) to take the project through mid-October from when our current budget is anticipated to run out in July. We are also assuming that there will be some oversight and visits required during Phases 3 and 4 of the Project, after EPA have left and during the period when the field is being constructed, as well as contractor punch list items.

Office support for the construction phase is also included under this task and will include part-time commitments for the Project Manager/Senior Scientist, LSP, and engineering staff. Task 1 includes review and response to contractor's Request for Information (RFI), review and approval of pay requisitions, weekly meetings, and the preparation and electronic delivery of weekly reports to the City and monthly reports to EPA.

This line item also includes a limited budget to address unknown conditions such as the current utility drainage question. We will engage a company to TV the line to evaluate where it connects to, as well as coordinate with the City's engineering department during construction.

Task 2 – MCP and TSCA Closure Reports

2.2 Activity and Use Limitation (AUL)

Weston & Sampson will prepare a draft AUL to support Site closure under the MCP and TSCA. A copy of the draft AUL will be submitted to the City for review and comment. We anticipate limited survey will be required to establish metes and bounds of the property. This document will be provided to the public for comment in accordance with the Public Involvement Plan (PIP). Following completion of the 20-day comment period, Weston & Sampson will assist the City in responding to comments and incorporate comments as appropriate. We will file the survey plan with the registry off deeds as well as the final AUL, which will also be uploaded to eDEP. We have included a copy for survey costs for filing of the AUL, which will likely be a portion of the property (and therefore requiring separate metes and bounds description).

We have also carried a sampling contingency cost in case sampling is required to document left in place concentrations, or if required for waste disposal. We will not use this contingency unless approved by the City of Somerville.

2.1 Permanent Solution Statement (PSS)

Weston & Sampson will prepare a draft PSS to document site cleanup and closure. This is a comprehensive report, which will include summary of previous investigations, details of remedial activities and park construction, the results of risk characterization, and conclusions and is intended to closeout response actions under the MCP. In addition, the PSS will include an Activity and Use Limitation.

As a reminder, the PIP process will re-start once EPA has concluded oversight of the Project; therefore, the PSS is also subject to PIP requirements, including public review, presentation, and comment. The PSS will be provided to the public for comment in accordance with the PIP. Weston & Sampson will present the draft PSS to in a public meeting. Following completion of the 20-day comment period, Weston & Sampson will respond to comments and incorporate comments as appropriate. We will finalize the PSS and upload as appropriate.

2.2 Activity and Use Limitation (AUL)

Weston & Sampson will prepare a draft AUL to support Site closure under the MCP and TSCA. A copy of the draft AUL will be submitted to the City for review and comment. We anticipate limited survey will be required to establish metes and bounds of the property. This document will be provided to the public for comment in accordance with the Public Involvement Plan (PIP). Following completion of the 20-day comment period, Weston & Sampson will assist the City in responding to comments and incorporate comments as appropriate. We will file the survey plan with the registry off deeds as well as the final AUL, which will also be uploaded to eDEP. We have included a copy for survey costs for filing of the AUL, which will likely be a portion of the property (and therefore requiring separate metes and bounds description).

We have also carried a sampling contingency cost in case sampling is required to document left in place concentrations, or if required for waste disposal. We will not use this contingency unless approved by the City of Somerville.

2.3 TSCA Closeout Report

Weston & Sampson will prepare a report to document the Site closure to satisfy the requirements of TSCA, 40 CFR 761.61. This report will summarize construction and remediation activities at the Site, performed by both EPA and the City's contractor, noting adherence and deviations from the approved RBDP, and be delivered electronically to the EPA Region 1 PCB Coordinator.

Task 3 – Project Management and Additional Meetings

This task includes management of the contract finances for the remainder of the Project, including budget tracking and invoicing as well as internal controls to manage the project. We anticipate an additional six (6) meetings outside of regular weekly construction meetings to be attended by the Project Manager/Senior Scientist and LSP. Additional time also is reserved (preparation for 2-3 meetings) for our involvement by our TSCA expert, resident representative, and engineering staff.

COMPENSATION

Weston & Sampson understands that this task order contract is under our existing contract. As discussed, we will perform these tasks for a fee of \$311,115, as itemized in the table below.
