For a preferred vendor, Durable Medical Equipment is covered under the Unicare Indemnity plan 100% after the calendar year deductible is met.

For a non-preferred vendor, Durable Medical Equipment is covered 80% after the calendar year deductible. The 20% coinsurance amount does not count toward the out-of-pocket maximum.
