191788 - Requesting approval of a Home Rule Petition authorizing the increase of the number of liquor licenses that the Licensing Commission may issue.:

Solicitor Wright and Mr. May addressed the committee and spoke about the experiences of other communities in dealing with license quotas. The number of licenses that a city may have is based on its population and Somerville needs to stay competitive with other communities in order to attract investments.

Alderman Gewirtz asked that the Law Department research what is happening at the state level with respect to liquor licenses.

Vice Chairman White requested a print out of all liquor licenses in the city, indication which are "all form", "beer and wine" and transferrable.

Alderman Connolly requested that a representative of the Licensing Commission be invited to appear at a future Legislative Matters Committee meeting to discuss this proposed Home Rule Petition and the various types and numbers of licenses.
