
# Gobble x 3 Race 2019 Course Request Discussion.

Due to the Broadway Bridge closure at Ball Square, our normal G3 race course is not feasible. Even as we make this application, we realize the city is attempting to determine the impact of the bridge closure on local traffic.

We would very much like to do whatever we can to allow the race to continue. So here I actually propose two alternatives. Our preference is for **Alternative #1** but if the city does not like that, we hope they will consider **Alternative #2** 


# Original Course (not possible this year)

### Alternative #1


The alternative we prefer is much like the original course above. The only differences are **a)** Runners turn *right* at the start on to Broadway (instead of left) and **b)**, Runners take a short detour around the bridge via Boston Ave, Morrison Street and Cedar Street, rejoining Broadway on the other side. Aside from that, this course is identical to the traditional route.



## Alternative #2

In case the city decides against our Alternative #1 we would at least like to propose a different, long-established 5K race course traditionally used by the May "MOM's"5k which covers only 4 streets, Highland Ave, Willow St, Summer St and Vinal Ave. This has the advantage of completely avoiding Broadway, Powderhouse Circle, Medford and Central Streets. It also starts and finishes in the same location,

Next to the Middlesex Bank on Highland Ave.



We hope we can continue our race for the  $23^{\rm rd}$  year with at least one of these proposals.
