

The City Charter requires that the replacement be approved by a majority of the remaining Board members but is silent as to the specific process.

In recent years we have seen all too often the Board simply appoint the out-going official's recommended successor without any serious deliberation or input from voters. This does a disservice to our city and the democratic principles we all hold dear. It also creates a disincentive to serve out a term because the resigning alderman is guaranteed that the successor he or she recommends will be appointed.

To address this serious concern, we hereby respectfully request a public hearing by the Board of Aldermen. It is our hope that a more open, transparent and consistent process for filling interim vacancies be identified and codified before we face this issue again.
