## **Application Narrative**

### **Project Summary**

The Somerville Fire Department is requesting a grant to purchase 8 portable radios, 8 remote speaker microphones as well as various radio features to remain interopable with other radios within the Boston UASI district, which Somerville Fire is part of. These portable radios will be frontline radios used by members in fire suppression. The cost includes a 3-year service warranty. The cost estimate is from the sales representative from Motorola Solutions and not a radio vendor who sells Motorola radios.

## Project Need

Please explain the reason grant funding is needed to purchase this equipment and connect it to one of the Purchase Justification options listed in the Notice of Funding Opportunity (i.e. There are 10 firefighters on my department without a compliant second set of turnout gear, my department has one thermal imaging camera which was purchased in 2012 and no longer functions properly, etc.).

This grant would replace at least eight XTS 5000 Motorola portable radios that have been in service since at least 2006. These portable radios are at the end of life. Repairs and replacement parts are no longer being manufactures by Motorola. There are currently twelve XTS 5000 radios still in service. Some of these radios have issues such as broken screen, or missing knobs. The eight Apx6000 portables requested in the grant will help in replacing old radios.

#### Investment Summary (describe your project)

This is a grant request via the FY 2022 Firefighter Safety Equipment Grant Program to replace old portable radios that are PAST life expectancy with current Motorola APX6000 radios that comply with Boston UASI Interoperability requirements.

#### Communications Interoperability Problem Description

Somerville Fire Department is part of the Boston UASI District. To comply with the current interoperability requirements via UASI and the Statewide Interoperability plan, we would use the the grant (if awarded) to purchase portable radios that meet these requirements.

#### Background Information / Detailed Investment Description

The first round of grant funded portable radios purchased was over 15 years ago. At that time Motorola XTS5000 radios were purchased to ensure interoperability within the UASI region as well as the State. These radios are passed their life expectancy. Although Somerville Fire has purchased radios, both by grant and as municipal investment, there are still some older radios that run as front line suppression radios that must be replaced with newer APX radios.

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If awarded, the grant will assist in keeping current interoperability requirements current.
