Good afternoon Shannon and thanks to everyone in Somerville for the timely review of Crown Castle's Eligible Facilities Requests. I copied your email request below and responded in red:

Pursuant to our conversation last night, I am writing to follow up in writing on the attached eligible facilities requests to modify 16 base stations in Somerville filed on September 16, 2019.

Pursuant to 47 C.F.R. §1.40001(c)(3)(i) the City hereby provides Crown Castle via this email communication with written notice that the attached requests are incomplete and submission of the following documentation and/or information is necessary in order for the City to continue its review of these applications:

1) Site 70 and Site 71 are missing stamped engineering plans. This is necessary for the City to conduct a review of these applications and ensure they are consistent with state building code requirements as allowed for during Section 6409(a) review; and

Attached, please find the plans stamped by the engineer. My apologies for this oversight.

2) The requests are missing information concerning the "color" of the new proposed modifications of transmission equipment that will be placed on the base stations. The current equipment at these locations is painted brown - a condition of prior approval and a concealment element. Without information on the intended color of this new equipment, the City has no way of making a determination on whether Crown Castle's proposed modifications constitute a "substantial change" – whether these requests meet the criteria under 47 C.F.R. §1.40001(b)(7)(v) and (vi) specifically which requires modifications comply with "existing concealing elements" and "prior conditions of approval."

Crown Castle agrees to keep the same color scheme as the existing equipment on all of the locations. I will confirm this commitment in my cover letter transmitting copies of the stamped plans referenced above in item 1. I hope such a commitment will address this issue.

The above-listed information and documentation is necessary and reasonably related to the City's review of whether the attached "eligible facilities requests" meet the requirements of 47 C.F.R. §1.40001. As soon as the City has this requested additional information and/or documentation, it can continue forward with the review of these requests accordingly.
