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Hi Vanessa and the rest of the UFC.

I'd love to be a member of Somerville's UFC. I became interested in urban forestry about five years ago, when a colleague and I proposed and then created a class at Boston University called "Environmental Equality and Urban Tree Canopies." We're currently teaching the course for the fourth year, and we have learned so much and made so many amazing connections throughout the greater Boston community. This class, in which students form teams and complete a project under the guidance of a community partner, has resulted in collaborations with: Bio4Climate, Tree Eastie, Mass Audubon, City of Boston Urban Forestry, Speak for the Trees, Green Cambridge, Boston Nature Center, and City of Boston Urban Wilds. These collaborations and projects have given us and the students a hands-on education regarding urban forest plans, tree canopy discrepancies and approaches to mitigate them, redlining and greenlining, community outreach, bureaucracy, and so much more. This semester, we're planting 75 trees with Tree Eastie (including related training), assessing the health of trees planted in the fall (including related training), developing an outreach and awareness campaign for vulnerable residents in East Boston, and we're designing and promoting the planting of a Miyawaki forest on BU's campus in April. I'm a steward of Somerville's Miyawaki forest and have participated in the planting of that one and the two in Cambridge, and a few of us have been working on this campus forest for years now. Seeing the effects our work has on the community and on students has been beyond inspiring--so much so that I plan on getting a graduate certification at BU in Applied Sustainability so I can do more of this work.

Just last week I completed all of the volunteer hours required to obtain my certification as a master urban gardener. I completed all of the coursework last spring through the Trustees of the Reservations. Taking this class has been the highlight of my year. Not only was it delightful to be a student instead of a teacher, but I learned so much through the class and through the other people taking it, almost all of whom work for environmental/sustainability organizations. Among other things, I became familiar with Boston's Community Gardens, which I'd seen many times without understanding their history. While not a forest, the concept of communal gardening, especially in areas where food agency is crucial, does connect to urban forest in terms of understanding and valuing green spaces and access to them.

I am passionate about trees and green spaces, and as a resident of Somerville--and someone whose home flooded a couple years ago in part because of the excess of pavement in the area--I understand

how important it is to make these spaces available to everyone, particularly those in less green areas. I would love to do more to promote environmental justice and community, and this seems like a perfect way to do that.
