Description: Founded in 2016 by experimental composers Aaron Foster Bresley and Luke Martin, The Co-Incidence Festival (www.coincidencefestival.com) is an annual gathering for experimental composer/performers, presented by Non-Event and hosted at Washington Street Art Center. Hailed by the Boston Globe as an event that "plays with, subverts, and breaks the rules of practice and performance of music," Co-Incidence will last 10 days and involve intensive daily meetings with the selected group of artists, who discuss, collaborate, rehearse, and perform together. The Festival (and this event) is done in collaboration with, and with funding from, the Somerville Arts Council (ArtsUnion program).

This specific event is a performance of a new work by the 2018 Resident Artist, Joachim Eckl (Austria): "SOUND BRIDGES". The piece is based on interdependence, warmth, and consciousness. Personal inner-spaces function as bridge-building locations and these inner connections are offered in a living process reaching out to others through space and time. There will be a central point or "listening circle" established in a location in Union Square. Performers will pair up in duos and spread out throughout the square. These duos will establish "sound bridges" across the square and intersecting the central point by making (i.e., drones, singing, percussive sounds; anything one can imagine). The sounds are to be 'as quiet as possible and as loud as necessary'. Performers must stay in connection with one another and build a strong sound-bridge; this relationship is then woven in with the other duos (increasing by one each day) making sound-bridges across the square. Thus it is an opensource sound-textile, woven together through social connection, into the sounds of the Square itself, and ever-changing.

The event will occur outside as a sound art performance spanning this area. Between 2-14 performers will be moving slowly through the space for seven consecutive days, one hour per day. The number of performers increases by 2 each day: Day 1 (2), Day 2 (4), Day 3 (6), Day 4 (8), etc.).

ANNOUNCING OUR 2018 SEASON!

The second season of the `co-incidence festival` will take place from January 19—28, 2018, at Washington Street Art Center in Somerville, MA. As with last year, the overarching goal of the festival is to bring together experimental composer/performers/artists to focus on collaboration, critical discussion, workshopping, and performance. In 2018, this will last 8 full days (not including arrival and departure days). The festival is directed by experimental composer/performers aaron foster breilyn and luke martin.

Though we have general conceptual areas that we would like to explore during the festival, we are open (and eager) to expand from there and allow the attending artists' constellations of concepts to influence the direction of the festival. We begin with an interest in the 'bridge', the 'swarm', and 'social sculpture'. These concepts can be found within one another as well as growing into one another (bridge to swarm to sculpture). The bridge becomes the swarm becomes social sculpture; yet the swarm is always implied by the bridge just as social sculpture is implied by both.

Common to all of these processes is the act of listening. The 'bridge', 'swarm', and 'social sculpture' all arise from different modes of listening; namely: 1) listening to things, hearing their minute, ordinary, explosive sounds, building a relationship with their sounds, yours, and those of the environment; 2) listening into things, hearing potential meanings, listening past the sounds, balancing this listening with that of the first (prior) order; 3) listening to an inner voice(s), a moral listening/judgement, energy flowing between inside and outside.

We are extremely pleased to announce that interdisciplinary artist / 'social engineer' Joachim Eckl (http://www.heimart.at/index.php/joachim-eckl.html) will be our Resident Artist for 2018. This position was held by Michael Pisaro in 2017 and we expect Joachim to bring yet another important perspective and artistic focus to the festival.

Sound Bridges (Joachim Eckl)

The Co-Incidence Festival will present a new public installation/performance work, composed by Austrian artist Joachim Eckl, in Union Square. There will be a central point or 'listening circle' established in a central location in Union Square. Performers will pair up in duos and spread out throughout the square. The sounds are to be 'as quiet as possible and as loud as necessary'.
