Greetings,

I recently learned that the City of Somerville is seeking residents to fill vacancies on several boards and commissions. I wish to apply for a full member position on the Planning Board. The opportunity strikes me as a great way to become further involved in planning and development issues in Somerville. I hope to convey a bit more about myself and my interest in serving below.

ABOUT ME

I've lived in the Boston area for 19 years and moved to Somerville as a tenant in March 2009 and then lived on Walnut Street beginning in 2010—and now my house on Wesley Park since 2016. Somerville has been a great community to call home. Its diverse mix of residents from all backgrounds and its walkable neighborhoods and squares are what attracted me to living here. I've been deeply committed to helping our community. I was involved in Union Square Neighbors, a neighborhood group, as well as the formation of the Union Square Neighborhood Council. I also served on MassDOT's McGrath Boulevard Project Development Working Group. I currently serve on the Board of Trustees for Cambridge Health Alliance and the board of directors for Union Square Main Streets.

Given the explosive growth of development in Somerville and the Boston metropolitan area more broadly, I think it is vital that we double down on efforts to ensure our planning goals are achieved, rather than be merely aspirational. SomerVision set targets for increased housing, affordable housing, commercial development, and open space. The Planning Board has an obligation and a responsibility to ensure that the development projects that come before it for approval are consistent with our community's values and goals as defined in SomerVision and the Somerville Zoning Ordinance. In the past, I've been frustrated by the lack of engagement, substantive inquiry, and respect for community input that previous members of the Planning Board have shown. I'm glad to see the tone has recently changed, and I would hope to build on that momentum if appointed.

As a community advocate, I have been involved in many community planning meetings and have offered comments on a variety of projects and zoning proposals before the Planning Board, the Zoning Board of Appeals, and the City Council (previously Board of Aldermen). I support mixed-use, transit-oriented development, particularly in our commercial corridor districts as well as "transformation areas." However, simply because a developer makes a "good pitch" does not mean we cannot or should not demand that they respect our community's planning goals and address our community's needs. Project details should be reviewed

thoughtfully and carefully to ensure they fully meet the requirements and expectations the Planning Board is empowered to carry out.

I am a strong supporter of affordable housing efforts and believe our community needs to make significant inroads to preserve housing options in Somerville for individuals and families of all income levels. Before moving to Massachusetts in 2000, I worked in a homeless shelter for families in Madison, Wisconsin where I was also as an appointee to Madison's Community Development Block Grant Commission. In Somerville, I continue to actively participate in community meetings and planning workshops. When the first iteration of the Union Square zoning was proposed, it did not include any provision for family-sized (3 bedroom) affordable housing units, despite being called for in the Union Square Neighborhood Plan. That was something we successfully added to the zoning. I also supported Somerville's Real Estate Transfer Fee Home Rule Petition as well as the redevelopment and addition of affordable housing units at Clarendon Hill.

I'm also enthusiastic outdoors person and have supported efforts to develop more and better open space for Somerville residents to enjoy and recreate. I was lucky enough to get a plot in a Somerville community garden (after a three year wait!), and now that I have a small yard, I'm slowly turning what was grass and asphalt into a perennial garden that includes native plants. When I volunteered for Big Brother/Big Sister, my "Little Brother" and I had fun playing at Foss Park, riding our bikes along the Mystic River path, and going to kid-friendly events at Trum Field and the High School.

Professionally, my background is in public policy and finance. I graduated from the Kennedy School of Government in 2002 with a focus on housing, infrastructure, and transportation planning. Since then, I've focused on health care policy and work as a consultant on issues centered on improving publicly funded health care for low-income people. My resume further summarizes my professional employment history and interests.

INTEREST IN SERVING

I believe I am a good candidate to serve on the Planning Board first and foremost because I value the input, ideas, and contributions of other people in decision-making processes. Decision-making with regard to planning and zoning requires careful consideration and respect of a variety of stakeholders including abutters, neighbors, and the community at-large. I am also deeply interested in issues of planning, zoning, and urban design, and I have invested time in understanding the local development process and the City's zoning ordinance. I am thoughtful and pragmatic person, and I would bring these qualities to the role.

I've always been committed to helping out in my community and working on issues and efforts that seek to preserve and enhance the quality of our lives. The responsibilities of the Planning Board speak to my own interests, and I would gladly contribute my time and energy. In conclusion, I would like to thank you for the opportunity to apply.
