January

- Healey-Choice Unification update

 - o Following along with Kindergarten Registration, the Administration of the Somerville Public Schools is currently studying projected enrollment for the 2011-2012 school year in order to ascertain needed classroom space and staff for next year. This is in the preliminary stages at this point.
- Reviewing the NEASC Draft report
 - o The Superintendent and Administration from Somerville High School have met to discuss the draft report of the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, following the recent accreditation process. The report from NEASC is due from NEASC in the Spring.
- Somerville High School student awarded full football scholarship to UMass Amherst
 - o Somerville High School senior, John Wallace, has been awarded a full scholarship to UMass Amherst, a Division I School, to play football there. Congratulations to John and his family!
- The School District has begun the budget process for FY2012. The first budget presented will be a level service budget. Mr. Pierantozzi announced the many factors which could influence the budget process including less local aid, a decrease in grants, increased transportation costs based on fuel prices, increased private placement tuitions for our special education students, charter school costs and other factors. The first presentation will be made at the next Finance and Facilities subcommittee meeting on February 2. Discussion took place among members regarding the best way to proceed with this process. Alderman Gewirtz reported on a revenue proposal, An Act to Invest in Our Communities, currently before the legislature and reported that she will forward this information to the School Committee.
