FY 2012 anticipated forfeitures: Chief Pasquarello has signed (5) DAG 71 forms that potentially

could bring in \$11,815.00.

(4) Question re: explanation of the amount of money spent for Court Time

For at least the last two fiscal years, we have exceeded out original budget for Court time. This fiscal year, we have been unusually below the normal amount of court time. I can attribute this to several factors.

- 1. Because our staffing of sworn officers has dropped, fewer officers will result in fewer court appearances. That will change with the addition of eleven new officers in July.
- 2. Due to the shooting and stabbing of several officers resulting in extended disability leave for several officers, cases that would have already have resulted in one or multiple court appearances have been continued. Some have been cleared but others remain in progress and will likely extend past the summer.
- 3. Whenever we add new officers, court time increases. This is reasonably predictable.
- 4. There was an absence of violent and major crimes that resulted in fewer criminal trials last year. Both homicides that we had in the current fiscal year did not result in a criminal trial.


