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Call for a Public Hearing on a Green New Deal for Somerville

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The undersigned residents of Somerville petition our City Council to hold a public hearing on adopting a **Green New Deal** for the City of Somerville to promote the goals listed below.

Somerville has received \$73.5 million in federal **American Rescue Plan Act** funding and is due to receive a portion of the \$9.5 billion of federal **Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act** funding allocated to Massachusetts for economic development.

Somervine Stands Together (351), a coantion of community, labor, and environmental organizations working for economic and social justice, is committed to seeing the city use those funds in ways that promote.

- Increased economic, social, and racial equity
- Achieve municipal carbon neutrality by 2035
- Adopt model project labor standards
- Train a local workforce for the future

In September 2020, SST hosted a **Somerville Labor and Climate Summit** to develop a "Green New Deal for Somerville." We proposed major revisions to the city's 2018 "Climate Forward" plan; emphasizing local hire, union jobs, racial equity, workforce development, and establishing benchmarks to achieve carbon neutrality. SST has also suggested multiple new "shovel ready" projects. In August 2021, SST presented the municipal Green New Deal plan to candidates for Mayor and City Council. *All of the elected candidates supported the plan*.

Therefore, we petition the City Council to hold a public hearing on adopting a Green New Deal that will promote social, economic, and racial justice in Somerville and achieve carbon neutrality by 2035.
