13. Ordinance 202626 (ID:15358) By Ald. Davis, Niedergang, Rossetti, McLaughlin, Sullivan, Ballantyne, McWatters, Heuston, White Jr. Proposing an Ordinance to safeguard vulnerable road users.
- Alderman Davis stated that this Ordinance would require City contractors and certain City vehicles to install specific safety measures such as truck side guards and mirrors. The objective is to increase safety between bicyclists, pedestrians and motorists. It's based on an Ordinance passed in Boston two years ago. Alderman Davis sponsored Alex Epstein to speak on this matter. Mr. Epstein, General Engineer at the Volpe Center, US DOT, said Somerville cannot legislate vehicle design, but can use its considerable contracting powers, like New York City and San Francisco, to make trucks safer. Alderman Heuston expressed concerns about enforcement. Alderman Ballantyne asked for more data. Mr. Epstein said the data is limited, but with this Ordinance, one life has been saved in Boston.

- Alderman Rossetti requested the Administration reconsider parking restrictions during snow emergencies on Whitman Street. Mayor's Legislative Liaison Tim Snyder explained the history of snow emergency parking regulations, and the decision to switch between odd and even sides each year to more equitably distribute the hardship caused by the snow and street plowing. Only streets with parking, or housing, on only one side are exempted. The City will evaluate the success of this program after this year, and will not consider exemptions at this time. Alderman Rossetti asked how constituents can complain, and Mr. Snyder advised them to call 311.

- Alderman Rossetti reported on the High School Building Committee's meetings on December 12 and 20. The Committee tried to reduce the cost of the project by removing items that were non-educational and didn't impact community use or improve Central Hill. There was much discussion of energy efficiency and carbon neutrality. The current building design is not extravagant. The roof will be solar panel ready, but will not have solar panels installed. If we must shave off \$30 million, the parking garage will come off. As the MA School Building Authority will only reimburse \$312 per square foot, costs exceeding that are the responsibility of the City. The Committee voted to remove the parking garage but leave the athletic field in place. The next meeting is with the Authority on February 15, 2017.
