Heuston	That the Chief of Police provide a detail to monitor traffic traveling from Somerville Avenue through Union Square onto Webster Avenue from 7:30 to 9 AM Monday through Friday, cite motorists violating the red light or blocking traffic on Webster Avenue during school drop off times, and determine the need for a police detail at the Charter School during drop off and pick up hours.	Assigned to the Traffic Bureau for targeted response. NOTE: Due to the snow conditions, enforcement action has not yet taken place due to safety concerns. There is no place in the area of the violations where vehicles can be safely stopped due to snow mounds. Enforcement will commence when it is safe to do so.
1-13-11	190696	By Ald. Roche, Sullivan	That the Chief of Police monitor traffic and cite motorists making illegal U-Turns on Broadway, from Cross Street to Mount Vernon Street.	Patrol notice issued to all units

Roche, Sullivan	That the Chief of Police inform this Board if the Mayor's public statement of the city's support of all immigrants includes eliminating the SPD's General Order 2009-11, which states in part that notification of the Immigration and Customs Enforcement Agency will only be authorized if a non-resident is arrested for murder, sexual offenses, narcotics trafficking, or other serious offenses.
