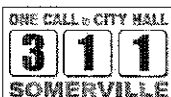

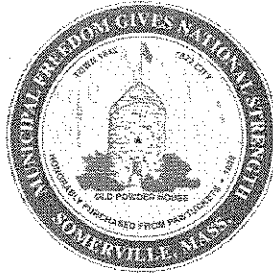



On May 6, 2009, MaxPac developer KSS Realty Partners signed a Covenant with the City of Somerville. The Covenant included the following language:

*(7) Union Labor: The City encourages the Developer to use union labor for the project and to enter into a Project Labor Agreement.*

The Board of Aldermen voted unanimously in favor of this provision. Yet, in spite of the language found in the Covenant, the developer has publically stated that they will not sign any agreement that commits to using union labor or hiring local residents.

We applaud the Board of Aldermen's inclusion of such language in the Covenant and further appreciate the recent unanimous vote by the Board requesting that Somerville residents have an equal opportunity to work on the project.
