1. Approval of the September 30, 2020 Minutes

### **Engineering**

- **2. 209610: Discuss** (White Jr., Niedergang) That the City Engineer and Commissioner of Public Works inspect the sidewalk on the east side of Cedar Street for all instances of spalling, and report to this Council 1) what caused it, 2) how the City will correct it, and 3) what measures the City will take against the contractor, if it was caused by improper installation.
- **3. 210426: Discuss** (Clingan) That the City Engineer and the Director of Water and Sewer appear discuss with this Council's Committee on Public Utilities and Works plans to address multiple drainage issues, including the broken drain on Medford Street at School Street and the insufficient drainage on Richdale Avenue.
