- 1. 211825: Discuss (Scott, Ballantyne, Davis, Mbah) That this Council consider passage of a Home Rule Petition enabling a "right to charge," similar to HD4109 or Chapter 370 of the acts of 2018, ensuring that tenants are provided access to charging stations.
- 2. 211830: Discuss (Scott, Davis, Mbah) That the City Solicitor advise this Council on the restrictions of public notice posting requirements for local businesses, particularly as it relates to business practices such as wages.
- 3. 212595: Discuss Submitting the 2021 Surveillance Technology Annual Report.
- **4. 212572: Recommend** (Davis, White Jr., McLaughlin) That the City Solicitor work with this Council to amend the anti-nepotism ordinance to allow for more flexibility when the circumstances warrant.
- **5. 211952: Recommend** Requesting adoption of the attached Rental Registration and Energy Disclosure Ordinance.

would require the Mayor to annually submit to this Council a report on the status of housing.
