4] What three issues concerning women in Somerville would you like to see the Commission work on?

Helping teenage Somervillens by creating an afterschool outreach program and somehow finding a way to make it "cool" for them to attend. One way we can do that is by finding a network of local Somerville mentors, women who are pillars of

success in our community. These mentors will work with the girls, helping the girls set up and consider 10 year plans for themselves.

I also want to help continue the search for quality speakers for the next year's SCW public speaker series. And, I wish to contribute to helping SCW commissioners with any task to make the series its most effective.

Another focus is making sure that college-bound Somervillens are prepared to succeed. A recent NYT opinion piece stated that inbound college students are often overwhelmed, struggle socially, in their first years at college—especially if they come from lower-income households or are the first in their families to attend. Perhaps create a speaker series for success in college for college girls.

5] After considering the current focuses of the commission, what area are you most interested to contribute or propose for new efforts?

Expanding domestic violence resources. Recently, a California moving company received press after offering to move domestic violence victims for free. The moving company provides their services for free. I would like to bring that same concept to Somerville, finding 1-2 moving companies in the Boston-area that would provide their services free of charge for Somerville women (and their children) escaping dangerous home environments.
