1. Approval of the March 30, 2021 Minutes

Eversource

- 2. 21225: Discuss (Ballantyne, Clingan, White Jr.) That Eversource representatives be requested to appear before the next meeting of this Council's Committee on Public Utilities and Public Works to respond to the gas leak data along Somerville Avenue.
- **3. 210739: Discuss** (Niedergang, Ewen-Campen, Strezo) That the Director of Engineering and the Director of Infrastructure and Asset Management urge Eversource to fix gas leaks at 721 Somerville Avenue and nearby, as identified by HEET, and appear with Eversource staff at the next meeting of the Council's Committee on Public Utilities and Public Works to discuss this matter.
