The Somerville Appointments Advisory Committee ("AAC" or the "Committee") recommends Tim Talun, Heidi Cron, and Kerri Connolly for appointment to the vacant positions on the Urban Design Commission (UDC).

The Committee was impressed with Tim Talun for his continued commitment to the City and willingness to serve the public good. As he is an architect, he demonstrated a depth of knowledge and sound judgement that made him stand out from other well-qualified applicants regarding the importance of our public realm. As there is a need to balance expiration dates for this relatively new commission, we recommend that Tim be appointed to the Full Member position that expires or is up for renewal in 2024.

The Committee was also pleased with our discussion with Heidi Cron. Her background includes design experience but from a different perspective that architecture or landscape design and has an open-minded viewpoint from working internationally. The Committee recommends that Heidi be appointed to the Full Member position with a term expiring in 2025.

With a background in journalism and urban planning, the AAC recommends Kerri Connolly to the Alternate Member position with a term expiring in 2024. Kerri is a pragmatic and patient collaborator who prides herself on talking through realities to find compromises which will be a significant strength for the design review process.

Members of the commission,

I am writing today to ask you to consider me for a Resident position on the Urban Design Commission (UDC). I believe my unique history, academic background, and professional experience would be of value to the commission in fulfilling their mandate to the citizens of Somerville.

I was born and raised in Somerville. I grew up on Winslow Avenue in Ward 6, and am a product of the city's public school system. I attended primary school at the Brown and Kennedy schools, and graduated from Somerville High in 2002. I received my undergraduate degree in urban planning from the College of Art, Architecture and Planning at Cornell University, and have a Master's in Journalism from the University of California at Berkeley. I currently work at Google as a strategist for the Google News products.

I am interested in participating in the UDC for two primary reasons. First, I studied urban planning, as well as conservation, design, and architecture. And though I chose not to pursue urbanism as an academic or as a professional, I remain highly interested in these subjects and their practice in Somerville.

The second reason is even simpler: because I want to see useful, aesthetically pleasing public spaces enjoyed by citizens across this city.

Somerville is where I grew up, and, after many years living away, where I am a resident of once more. The development of Union Square, the impact of the GLX, Somerville High School's renovation, the improvements to the West Branch Library—all projects whose outcome I care deeply about. I grew up spending afternoons in the West Branch Library. My locker was on the fourth floor of the high school, in the wing next door to City Hall. I took the Red Line to soccer practice, and lived with my best friends in an apartment on Prospect Street, right by the bridge. This is my home, and I want to serve my community by helping to make sound, thoughtful decisions about infrastructure, developments, and green spaces where Somervillians live their lives.

I have many skills that would benefit the UDC. I am trained in design thinking: how to consider the generic interests of a majority of users alongside the specific concerns and experiences of smaller, but no less important, niche groups. And, yes, while the construction of a plaza and the building of a software app may result in very different final products, the processes and perspectives that go into producing them are the same: both require deep consideration of a user's (resident's) position, orientation, motivations, resources, and abilities. Both require critical thinking, but above all else, require empathy.

For these reasons among many, I believe my perspective would be of value to the UDC.
