5. Order 209058 (ID:21904) By City Councilor Rossetti That the Director of Health and Human Services report to this Council the plan for an emergency response to the increased risk of disruption to the potable water supply due to water contamination from strong storms caused by climate change.

Councilor Rossetti expressed the need for a plan for potable water.

Councilor Rossetti reported that the High School project is still running on time but there is very little margin for error. There are about 178 workers on site daily. A third shuttle van has been added to get students between the High School and the Edgerly School where some classes are held. Shadowing internship and co-op opportunities are being offered to all seniors this year. A Dedication Committee has been formed. The Department of Education will be reviewing the Career Tech Ed Program, since there has been some disruption with those classes. Finally, the contingency account has increased to \$3.2 million.

Councilor Niedergang sponsored Peyton Kennedy, a constituent who explained why it is important to ban gas powered leaf blowers. She said one leaf blower emits as much pollution as hundreds of cars, and their noise is as loud as 100 decibels, which can cause hearing loss to the operator. Councilor Hirsch said she'd like the opinion of the DPW since they use leaf blowers.

31. LAND USE COMMITTEE

- A. Committee Report 209084 (ID:21878) Report of the Committee on Land Use, meeting on October 22, 2019.

Councilor Davis reported that the Committee discussed the Zoning Overhaul. The Committee decided that accessory buildings should be limited to one and a half stories for new construction. The Committee discussed landscaping and impervious surfaces and suggested that the definition of landscaping not include driveways.

Councilor Niedergang asked whether future meetings on the Zoning Overhaul could be Committee of the Whole meetings so all members could participate. Councilor Davis said he would continue with regular Committee meetings, to expedite consideration of the overhaul. He said it's almost impossible to find nights where there are no meeting conflicts, and Councilors can provide input through the Planning staff or directly to him.

32. LEGISLATIVE MATTERS COMMITTEE

- A. Committee Report 209085 (ID:21877) Report of the Committee on Legislative Matters, meeting on October 17, 2019.

Councilor Niedergang reported that most of the meeting was spent discussing an ordinance for the deployment of 5G small wireless facilities. Mayor's Aide Annie Connor recommended approval, even though the design standards have yet to be finalized, but the Committee wanted to first see final design standards. The Committee urged increasing the minimum distance between antennas and windows to 20-25 feet, and restricting noise levels. The Committee then left the Tenant Right of First Refusal in committee and discussed the Jim Brooks Home Rule Petition, to provide tenants with increased rights and powers. Director of Housing Stability Ellen Schachter said her Office doesn't have the staff to take this on at this time. The Committee suggested that it could be done by Committee members or by volunteers, and took no action. Finally, the Administration presented a Home Rule Petition to expand the scope of the Affordable Housing Trust Fund, to allow it to support housing-related programs and start-up costs for new affordable housing initiatives. Expansion is needed because the State DOR has changed the rules and the Trust is no longer able to fund things like homelessness prevention, domestic violence programs, etc. Councilor McLaughlin proposed an amendment stating that no City Department could receive funding from the Trust, and the Home Rule Petition was approved with that amendment.

After the Committee report was presented, Ms. Schachter expressed concern to the City Council that the amendment could tie the hands of the City. She said that an ordinance would be required anyway if the Petition were passed by the State, and that would be a better place for any restrictions. The City Council then voted to approve the original Petition, without the amendment.

33. TRAFFIC AND PARKING COMMITTEE

- A. Committee Report 209086 (ID:21876) Report of the Committee on Traffic and Parking, meeting on October 16, 2019.

Councilor Niedergang reported on that most of the meeting was spent on the Broadway Winter Hill bus and bike lanes. Councilor Clingan expressed concern about the Thurston Street crosswalk that was part of the project design but has not been implemented, and he urged the Administration to get it done before the snow. There was a detailed discussion about traffic enforcement with Sergeant Gobel and Lieutenant Polito, and in response to an Order to add more police officers to the traffic division, they said they would be adding two additional officers. The Bravo Unit of 6 officers doing traffic enforcement on bicycles have now been pulled off that assignment and will not be replaced. The Committee discussed enforcing nonresident use of residential streets, but Sergeant Gobel said it would be impossible to enforce, as they would have to stop everyone and ask for proof of residence, which isn't legal without cause. The Committee also discussed implementing parking restrictions for certain new developments, and limiting residential parking permits for properties that are granted zoning relief from parking requirements.
