**Programming** Use the Armory to produce art that resonates with the Somerville community

**Programming** decisions are the responsibility of tenants

## **Roles & Responsibilities**

Governance	City of Somerville Armory Advisory Board	Non-profit or Cultural Trust
Management	City staff + contractors	TBD: City staff + contractors
Programming	Tenants	Tenants

#### Independent governance from the City is preferred long term

more robust management services are valued

## The Balancing Acts are many...

- 1. Armory meets its public purpose *without* the City running events
- 2. Give tenants a voice in decisions *while recognizing* that not all tenants will have the same perspective nor will the neighbors
- 3. Tenants need affordable space to create *but* the building needs to generate enough revenue to sustain support services
- 4. Wrap up this process quickly enough to stabilize tenancies *and also* keep the pathway to independent governance progressing

Allow the Armory to evolve

Only make decisions that need to be made
