We the undersigned, registered voters of the city of Somerville hereby petition the Somerville City Council to identify and fund, at their earliest convenience, an independent contractor to collect real time data on the actual usage of existing bicycle and bus lanes and the impacts, both positive and negative on safety, traffic, livability and mobility, city wide. We request that the process and reporting be fully transparent and that data include a description of the percentage of current residents served by each mobility proposal. We request that current Mobility proposals, which will radically alter traffic and parking to accommodate increases in bicycle and bus lanes, be suspended until such time as it can be demonstrated that they offer changes which are considered to be needed improvements to a majority of stakeholders and that they offer equity across our extremely diverse population.
